DALLAS, TEX., APRIL 4 (AP)-THE DALLAS PARK BOARD VOTED UNANIMOUSLY TODAY TO RETAIN THE STORY OF HISTORICAL EVENTS IN DALLAS ON THE MARKER TO BE PLACED AT THE SPOT WHERE PRESIDENT JOHN F. KENNEDY WAS ASSASSINATED.

PROTESTS HAD BEEN RAISED LAST MONTH BY A GROUP SEEKING TO MAKE THE SITE A MEMORIAL ONLY TO THE LATE PRESIDENT.

PARK BOARD MEMBERS SAID OTHER HISTORIC EVENTS WERE IMPORTANT TO THE SITE OF THE ASSASSINATION.

A CONTRACT WAS AWARDED TO THE TRINITY ROAD AND BRIDGE CO., TO BUILD THE GRANITE MARKER-WITH FOUR BRONZE PLAQUES DESCRIBING THE EVENT. THE MARKER WILL COST \$8,249.

THE BOARD APPROVED FOUR PLAQUES, THREE DESCRIBING HISTORIC EVENTS INCLUDING THE ASSASSINATION AND THE FOURTH TO INCLUDE A MAP OF THE PARADE ROUTE, THE SPOT OF THE ASSASSINATION, AND THE SITE OF THE PROPOSED KENNEDY MEMORIAL PLAZA A BLOCK AWAY.
