

Kennedy Grave

No special ceremonies are planned for today's third anniversary of the assassination of the late President Kennedy.

Senator Robert F. Kennedy (Dem-N.Y.) and other members of the Kennedy family were expected to make quiet visits to the gravesite at Arlington Cemetery, where a permanent, \$2 million memorial gravesite is nearly completed.

More than 11 million people have visited the Kennedy grave. Slightly more than 3 million visitors are expected this year, compared with 4,029,000 in 1965 and 6,696,000 in 1964.

The permanent site, just below the present grave, is nearly finished except for landscaping. The bodies of Mr. Kennedy and two of his children who died shortly after

er birth will be moved about 40 feet to the new graves next spring.

The wind-whipped eternal light, which can be seen across the Potomac river in Washington, also will be moved and placed on a four-foot-tall pedestal.
