Nations Still Raising Memorials to Kennedy; Many

WASHINGTON, Nov. 23 (UPI)—Four years after the death of President Kennedy, nations of the world are still building, dedicating and plan-ning memorials to honor him.

Most of the new Kennedy memorials are living monu-ments rather than statuary, a survey indicates.


In Panama, where existing Kennedy memorials included a street, a fire truck and three schools, a Kennedy Park was built this year.

Schools bearing the Kennedy name are reported far and wide, and from Brazil came the report that "almost every Bra-zilian town has a Kennedy school."
