Also a clipping from the States-Item of
11Jan71 about the death of Jules Delaune. He died on
Jan. 10, a Sunday, and this is all the States-Item has
carried on him. He's the brother of the widow of Dr.
Nicholas Chetta, the New Orleans coroner who died
mysteriously. Another brother, Dr. Henry DeLaune, was
murdered mysteriously 26Jan69, five days after jury
selection began in the first Shaw trial. The second
Shaw trial was due to begin 18jan71, but after a futile
attempt to appeal it to the Louisiana Supreme Court Shaw's
attorneys took it to federal court and got a TRO against
proceeeding, with a hearing set for this coming Monday,
Jan. 25.

Here's hoping about the job, and let us know how things are going with you.
