Computer Finds A JFK 'Plot'

NEW YORK — (UPI) — A computer expert who analyzed 300 photographs and 25,000 frames of movies says President Kennedy was killed by a conspiracy involving more than 50 people, including some Dallas policemen and members of the CIA.

Richard Sprague, in a news conference yesterday, said four gunman at different sites killed Kennedy in a crossfire. Lee Harvey Oswald, the man named as the assassin by the official Warren Commission, was not one of them, he said.

Sprague, who runs a data service at Hartsdale, N.Y., said the assassination was "the most photographed murder in history," but that the Warren Commission examined only 26 of the 500 stills available.

His conclusions are printed in the May issue of "Computers and Automation."
