"J. Edgar Hoover was murdered," she snapped in re-sponse to a question. "He ingested apple pie and there were Cubans in his house. I'll stake my reputation on it."

Mr. Skolnick, who is confined to a wheelchair, contended that the Chicago airplane crash in which the wife of E. Howard Hunt Jr. died had

been caused by C.I.A. sabotage. But, he added, a document "which should have been written on asbestos" fluttered from the plane, became stuck on a bush and came into his possession. It was, he said, a National Security Council memorandum of Nov. 27, 1960, "three years to the date before," saying that "for the good of the Republic, John F. Kennedy should be re-moved."

Mr. Lane was visibly upset by such charges, and in the closing session today, when petitions urging new investiga-tions were distributed, warned against reaching conclusions beyond what could be substan-tiated. "We should not make statements that most reasonable Americans cannot accept," he said. "We cannot require an acceptance of the unbelievable. It will set us back 20 years. It is their credibility that must be at stake, not ours."
