# RUNYON'S FUNERAL SET IN CINCINNATI

WASHINGTON, April (UPI)-Private funeral services were scheduled in Cincinnati for Damon Runyon Jr., son of the famed author, who died in a plunge from a bridge here Sunday.

Mr. Runyon, 48 years old, Mr. Runyon, 48 years old, was found in a shallow creek under the 52-foot-tall P Street bridge with a press card tied around his neck. He was dead on arrival at Georgetown Hospital, 15 minutes after the fall. Like his father, Mr. Runyon had strong opinions about almost anything and he was particularly critical of newspaper

ticularly critical of newspaper writers and editors.

"My dad was originally a sportswriter," he once said. "Even today the sports depart-ment is the only place in a newspaper where you can show any talent."

He said the New York Herald Tribune had died because "we couldn't find any good writers, so we trained copy boys. Unfortunately, they all became editors. Then we had the printers' strike. They killed the printers' strike. That killed us."

WASHINGTON, (AP)—Mr. Runyon's death was officially ruled a suicide Mon-day by the District of Columbia coroner.
