**Cameraman
Of Kennedy
Killing Dies**

Dallas, Texas

Abraham Zapruder, the camera enthusiast who took the only movie film of the assassination of President Kennedy, died in a hospital here yesterday of cancer. He was 66.

Zapruder, a dress manufacturer originally from New York, filmed the killing from a vantage point near his office overlooking the Kennedy motorcade route Nov. 22, 1963.

The historic film became prime evidence for the Warren Commission, which investigated the murder and ruled that it was the work of Lee Harvey Oswald acting alone.

Another person connected with the fatal Kennedy visit here died Saturday. He was Dallas County Sheriff James Eric (Bill) Decker, 71, who was riding in the first car of the Kennedy motorcade when the President was killed.
