Marina Oswald Porter, the widow of President Kennedy's presumed assassin, asked a justice of the peace yesterday to place her husband of three months under a peace bond.

Mrs. Porter swore in a statement before Judge W. E. Richburg that Kenneth Jess Porter slapped her in the face and threatened to kill himself.

The Russian-born Mrs. Porter appeared at Richburg's court with her children. She said she feared Porter might harm her.

Porter reportedly was arrested by county officers a few minutes after Richburg gave officers a warrant for his arrest. Sheriff Bill Decker said, "the man is in custody."

Richburg said he issued the warrant after he telephoned Porter, an electronics worker, and asked him to come to his office "to talk things over."

The justice of the peace said Porter refused to come to the office and told him "to go ahead and issue a warrant."
