

These are the 12 points which convinced authorities that Lee Harvey Oswald assassinated President Kennedy:

1. Eyewitnesses saw a man fitting Oswald's description in the window of the Texas Schoolbook Depository building from which the fatal shots were fired. There may even be pictures showing him in the window. Many films were taken by bystanders. As they are developed, new evidence may come to light.
2. Oswald's fingerprints were found on book cartons at the murder window. A palm print on a box in the murder room was also established as being his.
3. Oswald had ordered an Italian-made rifle from a Chicago mail-order house, under an assumed name, but in his own handwriting. The serial number proved this was the gun found near the window right after the shooting. Ballistics tests proved that bullets from this gun killed the President.
4. Oswald's fingerprints were found on the murder rifle. Police also obtained a photograph of him holding a rifle which appeared to be the same one used in the slaying of the President. This picture also showed him wearing a pistol similar to that used in the slaying of Policeman J.D. Tippit. Oswald was reported by Police Chief Jesse Curry to be obviously shaken when confronted with this photograph during interrogation.
5. Paraffin tests revealed he had fired a gun recently.
6. A map was found in Oswald's room. It showed a line from the Schoolbook Depository building to the spot where the President was killed.
7. Witnesses put Oswald on the sixth floor of the Schoolbook Depository building at the time of the slaying.
8. Oswald caught a bus a short distance from the shooting scene a few minutes after the President was wounded, saying to the driver: "The President has been shot." The driver remembered the man and described him to police because, the driver said, after saying the President had been shot the passenger emitted a peal of laughter. A bus transfer was found in Oswald's pants pocket.
9. Apparently feeling the bus was not going fast enough, Oswald got out and hailed a cab. This cab took him to his rooming house, where his landlady saw him as he rushed in to put on a coat.
10. Oswald's next encounter was with Officer Tippit. A woman is said to have witnessed this murder.
11. A fellow worker reported he gave Oswald a lift to work Friday morning and that Oswald was carrying a long package. Oswald told his acquaintance it was window shades. Police say it was the murder rifle.
12. Oswald's Russian-born wife told police she had seen the rifle in their home.
