## The doubts persist

A MAJORITY of the American people, according to a Harris Poll Oct. 19, does not believe the Warren Commission Report answered all questions about the assassination of President Kennedy. And a strong minority thinks Lee Oswald was part of a conspiracy-despite the intensive propaganda campaigns to the contrary.

The poll was taken soon after the Report was made public. Compared with a Harris Poll taken before the findings were published, the percentage of Americans convinced that Oswald was the assassin increased from $76 \%$ to $87 \%$ ( $2 \%$ now believe he is innocent, opposed to $3 \%$ before the Feport, while $11 \%$ are "not sure," compared with $21 \%$ before the Report).
A total of $45 \%$ of those polled do not believe "the full story is in the Report." Another $10 \%$ are not sure.
To the question, "Do you feel Lee Harvey Oswald had accomplices or did he do it alone?", $31 \%$ were convinced Oswald was involved in a conspiracy (compared with $40 \%$ before the Report), $13 \%$ were "not sure," while $56 \%$ belleve that it was Oswald alone.
