WITH KENNEDY

TOKYO, NOV. 27 (AP)-COMMUNIST CHINA'S OFFICIAL NEW CHINA NEWS AGENCY (NCNA) FOR THE FIRST TIME REPORTED WITHOUT COMMENT EARLY WEDNESDAY THE FUNERAL SERVICES OF THE LATE PRESIDENT KENNEDY AT ARLINGTON NATIONAL CEMETERY.

NCNA, IN A BROADCAST MONITORED HERE, SAID BRIEFLY THAT THE SERVICES WERE ATTENDED BY SUCH WORLD DIGNITARIES AS BRITAIN'S PRINCE PHILIP, ANASTAS MIKOYA, SOVIET UNION'S FIRST DEPUTY PRIME MINISTER, JAPAN'S PRIME MINISTER HAYATO IKEDA, PRESIDENT DE GAULLE OF FRANCE, AND OTHERS.

THE ARTICLE WENT ON TO SAY THE NEW U.S. PRESIDENT LYNDON JOHNSON CONFERRED WITH DE GAULLE AND OTHER WORLD LEADERS AFTER THE FUNERAL.

MEANWHILE THE CHINESE BROADCAST COMMUNIST PRESS COMMENT OF PRESIDENT KENNEDY'S DEATH.

INDONESIAN COMMUNIST PARTY PAPER HARIAN RAKJAT:

"WHOEVER BECOMES ITS PRESIDENT, HE WILL CERTAINLY IN ONE WAY OR ANOTHER REPRESENT AND DEFEND THE INTERESTS OF MONOPOLY CAPITALISM WHICH IS BY NATURE IN CONFLICT WITH THE NEW EMERGING FORCES."

NORTH VIET NAM'S OFFICIAL NEWSPAPER NHANDAN EDITORIAL:

"KENNEDY IS DEAD, BUT THE IMPERIALIST POLICY OF THE UNITED STATES WILL REMAIN THE SAME."

PRO-COMMUNIST PATHET LAO RADIO COMMENTARY:

"THE LAOTIAN PEOPLE SHOULD NEVER HARBOR ANY ILLUSIONS ABOUT JOHNSON. NO MATTER WHO BECAME PRESIDENT, THE NATURE OF U.S. IMPERIALISM REMAINED UNCHANGED AND ITS POLICY WOULD CONTINUE TO BE AGGRESSIVE AND BELLICOSE."
