LONDON, NOV. 26 (AP)-THE WESTERN WORLD MUST STILL TRY TO REALIZE JOHN F. KENNEDY'S VISION OF A LIVE-AND-LET-LIVE DEAL WITH RUSSIA, FOREIGN SECRETARY R. A. BUTLER SAID TODAY.

"WE MUST NOT BE STUNNED BY THE LOSS WE HAVE SUSTAINED," BUTLER TOLD A LUNCHEON OF THE FOREIGN PRESS ASSOCIATION. "WE MUST GO FORWARD AND CARRY THE PROMISE OF HIS IDEALS INTO THE FUTURE."

BUTLER LISTED THREE POSSIBLE AGREEMENTS WHICH SHOULD BE PURSUED WITH THE RUSSIANS:

--SETTING UP OF OBSERVER POSTS ON BOTH SIDES OF THE IRON CURTAIN TO GUARD AGAINST SURPRISE ATTACK.

--STOPPING THE SPREAD OF THE CONTROL OF NUCLEAR WEAPONS.

--NEGOTIATING A NON AGGRESSION TREATY.

THE BRITISH STATESMAN SPELLED OUT SEVERAL CONDITIONS WHICH HE SAID MUST GOVERN ANY EAST-WEST ACCOMMODATION.

"IN ANY EAST-WEST DISCUSSIONS NOTHING CAN BE ACCEPTED WHICH WOULD UPSET THE MILITARY BALANCE AT PRESENT EXISTING," BUTLER SAID.

"THERE MUST BE NO AGREEMENTS OR NEGOTIATIONS WHICH MIGHT IMPAIR THE COHESION OF THE ALLIANCES.

"THE WESTERN POSITION IN BERLIN AND THE OBJECTIVE OF SELF-DETERMINATION FOR EAST GERMANY ARE OF VITAL WESTERN INTEREST.

"NOTHING MUST APPEAR TO UNDETERMINE THE FREEDOM AND VIABILITY OF WEST BERLIN."

BUTLER NOTED THAT PRESIDENT JOHNSON IS NOT THE ONLY LEADER OF A WESTERN POWER TO HAVE BEEN THRUST SUDDENLY INTO OFFICE IN THE IMMEDIATE PAST. THERE HAVE BEEN CHANGES IN THE GOVERNMENTS OF WEST GERMANY AND BRITAIN, WHILE ITALY ALSO IS FORMING A NEW REGIME.

"I REALIZE AS BRITISH FOREIGN SECRETARY WHAT A GREAT RESPONSIBILITY LIES ON OUR SHOULDERS IN THE WEST TO CARRY FORWARD AND MAINTAIN THE IDEALS WHICH WERE HELD BY THE LATE PRESIDENT KENNEDY," HE SAID.

BUTLER SAID, HOWEVER, THE BRITISH GOVERNMENT STILL RETAINS ITS RESERVATIONS OVER KENNEDY'S PROJECT F
