8000 Visitors to Oswald's Grave ---Still Guarded

## Fort Worth, Tex.

An estimated 8000 people have visited the grave of Lee Harvey Oswald on a hillside in Rose Hill cemetery but the number of visitors ap-pears to be decreasing, cemetery officials reported yesterday. Some have left flowers.

Jack Ruby, a night club operator, killed the accused assassin of President Kennedy November 24, and the body was buried the next day in a pine coffin in a hastily dug grave. Police still guard the grave, to prevent its desecration.
