But the "glorification" of President Kennedy since his as-sassination has temporarily made criticism identifying his Administration with Commu-nism "completely unthinkable," according to Robert H. W. Welch Jr., founder of the so-ciety.

Mr. Welch's Bulletin mes-sage, copyrighted by the soci-ety, reiterated the assertion that President Kennedy had been assassinated by a Commu-nist, acting under orders. Com-munist tactics regarding the assassination, the message said, 1 have been to shift the blame to settreme right-wing organiza-tions. The Birch Society is con-isidered one of these.
