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BUENOS AIRES, Argentina AP - A 19-year-old girl whose
parents said she went into a coma after hearing of the death of
President John F. Kennedy, woke up and spoke Tuesday for
the first time in nearly four years, a doctor said.

There was no report of what she said.

Dr. Perez Morales said Maria Elena Tello had been
flown here last week for special treatment after lying metienless
since 1965 in San Juan, a provincial capital in western Argentina.

He said she had been suffering from encephalitis
lethargica-sleeping sickness. Doctors previously had said
there was no chance of her recovery, but Morales said full recovery now
was very likely.

When Kennedy was assassinated in Dallas in November 1963, "she
heard the news on the radio and became desperate," the girl's mother
said. "She had a great admiration for Kennedy. "She seemed
to calm down in the next few days but then she became worse."

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
