Senator George Murphy (Rep-Calif.) said last week that the Justice Department assures him it would not voluntarily surrender the rifle used to assassinate President John

The Texan who claims he owns the rifle said he bought it from the widow of the late Lee Harvey Oswald, the accused assassin, after the assassination in Dallas.
