Johnson Signs Bill to Keep Control of Kennedy Rifle

Control of Kennedy Rifle

JOHNSON CITY, Tex., Nov.
2 (UPI) — President Johnson signed today legislation authorizing the Federal government to take ownership of the mailorder rifle used to murder President Kennedy.

The bill authorizes the Attorney General to designate items of evidence collected by the Warren Commission as Federal property. It was passed after John J. King, a Denvergun collector, put in a claim for the rifle and for the pistol that Lee Harvey Oswald used to kill a Dallas policeman, J.D. Tippit, on Nov. 22, 1963.

Mr. King reportedly purchased rights to the weapons from Oswald's widow for \$10,000. His claim for reimbursement has been made in the form of a suit against the Attorney General. It would be considered by a United States District Court or the United States Court of Claims under the legislation.
