LONG BEACH, CALIF., NOV. 24 (AP)-A DALLAS WOMAN SAID TODAY SHE MAY HAVE UNWITTINGLY PLANTED IN HER BROTHER'S MIND THE IDEA OF KILLING THE ACCUSED ASSASSIN OF PRESIDENT JOHN F. KENNEDY.

MRS. EVA L. GRANT IS A SISTER OF JACK RUBINSTEIN, ALIAS RUBY, THE 52-YEAR-OLD BACHELOR WHO SHOT AND KILLED LEE HAVREY OSWALD, ACCUSED SLAYER OF THE PRESIDENT.

THE LONG BEACH INDEPENDENT, PRESS-TELEGRAM, RECEIVED THE FOLLOWING ACCOUNT FROM ITS REPORTER BILL HUNTER, IN DALLAS:

MRS. GRANT TOLD HUNTER SHE THINKS SHE MAY HAVE PLANTED THE THOUGHT OF KILLING OSWALD BY REMARKS SHE MADE FRIDAY, AFTER THE PRESIDENT'S ASSASSINATION.

"I TOLD HIM (HER BROTHER), 'DON'T WORRY. SOMEONE WILL SHOOT ISWALD,'" MRS. GRANT SAID.

"HE TOLD ME, 'LOOK AT THE LOGIC OF THIS. OSWALD GOT TO THE PRESIDENT, BUT NO ONE CAN GET TO OSWALD.'"

MRS. GRANT CONTINUED, "WE ARE ORTHODOX JEWS AND DO NOT BELIEVE IN VIOLENCE. I HONESTLY BELIEVE HE WAS SO AFFECTED BY HIS (THE PRESIDENT'S) DEATH THAT HE ACTUALLY WENT OUT OF HIS MIND."

AN ACQUAINTANCE OF RUBY'S, J.L. CAMPBELL, TOLD THE NEWSMAN THAT RUBY "IS EMOTIONAL TO THE EXTENT HE WOULD WANT TO BE INVOLVED IN WHATEVER TRANSPIRED. HOWEVER, I HONESTLY BELIEVE HE WANTED TO SEE JUSTICE DONE."

CAMPBELL, 49, OWNS A SERVICE STATION ACROSS THE STREET FROM THE VEGAS NIGHTCLUB, WHICH RUBY OWNS.
