Dallas -- Judge Joe B. Brown, scheduled to preside at Jack Ruby's murder trial, said today that although he received credit for enrolling Ruby in the Chamber of Commerce it was another who signed up the night club sazzazia operator.

Brown said he had never seen Ruby until after Ruby was charged with murdering Lee Harvey Oswald, accused as President Kennedy's assassin.

Jim Henderson, an insurance man, said he believes he was the person who signed up the Vegas Cubb, which Ruby operated, in a 1959 Dallas Chamber of Commerce membership drive.

Henderson said the credit for enrolling Ruby was assigned to Judge Brown so Brown could become a life member of the organization. He needed credit for recruiting 100 members to become a life member.

Henderson said Ruby actually was in and out of the Chamber of Commerce at various times.

"Ruby never showed up at our luncheons," said Henderson.
