Dallas, April 9 (AP)- Lawyers fighting a legal battle to save Jack Ruby from the electric chair filed an amended motion today for a new trial for the once-dapper strip joint operator.

Judge Joe B. Brown who presided over the month long Ruby trial, has 20 days in which to hold a public hearing and then rule on the motion.

If Brown denies the new trial, Ruby's attorneys have indicated they will appeal to the Tezas Court of Criminal Appeals.

Dadlas Lawyer Phil Burleson filed today's motion. It alleged 196 specific errors to have been committed by Judge Brown during the trial.

Burleson also filed motions asking for the trial transcript and for an extension of time to allow filing of a second amended motion.

The first motion for a new trial was filed March 20.

The main errors alleged in the amended motion concern the qualifying of jurors who witnessed on television the slawing of Oswald, and Brown's denial of a change of benue motion.

RIXXXX Asst. D.A. Jim Bowie said the motionfiled today "looks about the same as the original motion."
