Dallas, May 20 (AP)- Jack Ruby, for legal purposes, is sane and is receiving no medication for mental illness, Dist. Atty. Henry Wade said today.

A published report said earlier the 53-year-old slayer of Lee Harvey Oswald was receiving "happy pills" or tranquillizers in his jail cell.

"I'm rather positive that he is not receiving pills of any sort," the prosecutor said in an interview. "Psychiatrists have been seeing him, and I guess you might call some of their questioning treatment."

Sheriff Bill Decker said he knows of no medical treatment being given the condemned killer "except perhaps for an aspirin now and then."

Wade yesterday was quoted as saying that Ruby was receiving medical treatment in jail and Judge Joe B. Brown was quoted as saying the 53-year-old slayer of Lee Harvey Oswald was receiving "happy pills." or tranquillizers, But today the Judge denied making the statement.

Wade said he has reviewed a report by Dr. Robert Stubblefield, a court-appointed psychiatrist, and does not believe Ruby needs to be sent to an institution.

Informed sources said the report, which has not been made public, says Ruby is believed suffering from depression and a persecution complex.

Wade said Ruby knows right from wrong and therefore is legally accountable for his acts.

The judge has said he wants to study other reports and confer with psychiatrists before deciding whether to order a sanity hearing.

Wade said the judge can order a sanity trial; call ~~for another~~ for another hearing with lawyers for additional information before making his decision, or deny the sanity trial motion.

"Regardless of which way the judge rules, we're going to have more sanity proceedings," Wade said.
