Dallas, June 2 (AP)- A June 19 show-cause ~~xx~~ hearing in open court has been scheduled to determine whether Jack Ruby gets a sanity trial. Meanwhile, the condemned slayer is receiving psychiatric treatment in his jail cell.

Judge Joe B. Brown gave permission for the treatment yesterday after three psychiatrists reported Ruby is mentally ill.

Brown refused to say if Ruby is legally insane but said he suffers from "depression and regression."

Dist. Atty. Henry Wade said such deterioration is common in the case of persons sentenced to death.

Ruby, 53-year-old night club operator, received the death sentence March 14 after a Dallas jury found him guilty of murder with malice in the shooting of Lee Harvey Oswald, alleged assassin of President Kennedy.

Brown announced that treatment for Ruby will start immediately.

"If he (Ruby) is not in better health by June 19, then a sanity trial will start July 6," Brown said.

Should the jury at the sanity trial decide Ruby is at present insane, he would be committed to a state mental hospital until again pronounced sane. If he should remain insane, he would not be executed in the state's electric chair.
