Ruby Judge Turns Down Error Claims

Dallas

Judge Joe B. Brown moved Jack Ruby's death sentence to the Texas Court of Criminal Appeals yesterday by rejecting all defense claims that he made any errors in conducting the Ruby murder trial.

Turning down the defense's main charge—that a police sergeant perjured himself on the witness stand—Brown said Melvin Belli, Ruby's former chief defense attorney, opened the line of questioning under which the sergeant testified.

All told Brown rejected 15 bills of exception (claims of error on his part) which defense lawyers filed July 28 as the first step in appeal-

ing Ruby's conviction to the State's highest appellate court.

Ruby was sentenced to death for the November 24 murder of Lee Harvey Oswald, the accused assassin of President Kennedy.
