DIST. ATTY. HENRY WADE'S OFFICE OPPOSED THE DELAY.

TEXAS LAW REQUIRES STATEMENTS TO THE COURT WITHIN 90 DAYS AFTER GIVING NOTICE OF APPEAL. SUCH NOTICE WAS GIVEN APRIL 29 IN RUBY'S CASE.

LATE IN JULY, JUDGE BROWN GRANTED THE LAWYERS A 90-DAY EXTENSION.
IT WOULD HAVE EXPIRED TOMORROW.

PROSECUTORS SAID THE DELAY WAS NOT ASKED ON TRANSCRIPTS OF THE TRIAL ITSELF, BUT ON PROCEEDINGS IN JURY SELECTION AND A CHANGE OF VENUE HEARING BEFORE THE ACTUAL TRIAL.
