Dallas, Jan. 7 (AP)- Joe Tonahill, a defense lawyer in the Jack Ruby murder trial, said today he has found "shocking incomsistencies" between the timony given at the trial and the testimony given the Warren commission.

The Jasper, Tex., attorney said he discovered numerous discrepancies after studying the 26 volumes of testimony recently released by the Warren commission, which was set up by President Johnson to provide the official investigation of the assassination of President Kennedy.

Ruby has been sentenced todie for the killing of Lee $\,^{
m Kennedy.}$ The verdict is being appealed.

Tonahill said he paid particular attention on that part of the commission report that dealt with Ruby's killing of $^{\circ}$ swald.

Tonahill and Melvin Beliix of San Francisco defenced Ruby when he was tried for the Oswald killing.

Tonahill said he expects to rely on what he called "new discoveries found in the Wa ren report when he argues Tuby's case before the Texas Court of Criminal Appeals in A stin. Oral arguments in the appeal do cold be in early spring, Tonahill said.

He declined to be specific about the alleged discrepancies but he said some of them were "startling."

Tonahill did say that he had reference to the testimony of some of the witnesses who were at the Dallas city hall Nov. 24, 1963, when Rub shot Oswald during a routine jail transfer.

The official Ruby trial records were moved yesterday from the Dallas County court house to the vault of a local transfer and storage firm.

A spokesman for the moving van company said the records would be taken to the appeals court in Austin next week.

The load includes 5,500 pages of statements of $\frac{f_{act}}{gae}$, a 482-page transcript and bundles of newspapers.
