

Hearing on Ruby's Sanity Planned by Dallas Judge

DALLAS, Feb. 25 (AP) — District Judge Joe B. Brown said today that he expected to hold a sanity hearing for Jack L. Ruby, based on an affidavit of insanity filed 10 months ago by defense attorneys. "The affidavit has been pending all this time," Judge Brown said. "It was never withdrawn and it is a sufficient basis for the court to act."

Ruby was sentenced to death for slaying Lee H. Oswald, President Kennedy's assassin.

The State Court of Criminal Appeals ruled yesterday that Judge Brown must determine Ruby's present mental condition before it would hear appeal arguments. 3
