DALLAS, APRIL 7 (AP)-JACK RUBY'S SISTER CLAIMS SHE IS UNABLE TO GET A JOB BECAUSE OF PREJUDICE AGAINST HER BROTHER.

MRS. EVA GRANT, MAKING HER WEEKLY JAIL VISIT TO SEE HER BROTHER, SAID SHE HAD APPLIED FOR NUMEROUS JOBS DURING THE PAST YEAR BUT WITHOUT SUCCESS.

SHE SAID SHE RECEIVED UNEMPLOYMENT BENEFITS FOR FOUR MONTHS UNTIL HER ELIGIBILITY WAS EXHAUSTED. SHE SAID THAT DURING THIS TIME SHE SOUGHT WORK THROUGH THE TEXAS EMPLOYMENT COMMISSION.

"THE PEOPLE AT THE EMPLOYMENT OFFICE WERE VERY NICE TO ME, BUT THEY SIMPLY COULD NOT GET ME A JOB," MRS. GRANT SAID.

SHE DESCRIBED HERSELF AS AN EXPERIENCED SALESWOMAN. SHE IS MIDDLE-AGED.

MRS. GRANT HAS BEEN TAKING A MAJOR ROLE IN THE APPEAL EFFORTS OF RUBY FROM A DEATH SENTENCE METED HIM BY A DALLAS JURY IN THE GUNNING DOWN OF LEE HARVEY OSWALD, ACCUSED ASSASSIN OF PRESIDENT JOHN F. KENNEDY.

MRS. GRANT SAID SHE INTENDS TO WRITE GOV. JOHN CONNALLY OF HER PLIGHT.

SHE SAID SHE HAS BEEN LIVING ON SMALL DONATIONS FROM HER BROTHER, EARL RUBY OF DETROIT.
