Dallas, Tex., May 6 (AP)- Judge Louis Holland of Montague, Tex., will take Judge Joe B. Brown's gavel May 24 in an effort to untangle the complexities of the Jack Ruby attorney snarl.

Judge Brown agreed today to temporarily relinquish jurisdiction for the hearing to determine what attorneys should represent Ruby in connection with his motion for a post-trial sanity hearing.

The Dallas judge said he requested the visiting jurist because "I believe I have been attacked by Joe Tonahill. In all fairness I think another judge should preside."

Presiding Dist Judge Dallas Blankenship said he appointed Judge Holland because the Montague man was already scheduled to preside in Judge Brown's court the week of May 24.

The request from Judge Brown asked for a substitute to settle the attorney question, but officials indicated later today that Judge Holland might also be asked to rule on motions to disqualify Judge Brown and change venue.

Tonahill, of Jasper, was appointed to represent Ruby by Judge Brown. Ruby family lawyers, who oppose Tonahill's presence in the case, and Tonahill have filed counter-motions designed to oust the opposition.

Informed of the hearing, Tonahill predicted "It's going to blast wide open."

He added that he thought Judge Brown should first rule on his own disqualification before any further action. Tonahill said he wrote Judge Brown a letter -- which was to be considered a motion -- that he should disqualify himself or set a date for a hearing.
