DALLAS, TEX., JULY 21 (AP)-PROSECUTORS FILED TODAY A MOTION URG-ING DIST. JUDGE LOUIA HOLLAND TO REJECT THE REQUEST BY ATTORNEYS FOR JACK RUBY SEEKING TO DISQUALIFY THE CASE'S ORIGINAL JUDGE.

HOLLAND IS EXPECTED TO CONSIDER THE MATTER TOMORROW IF HE CONCLUDES A MURDER CASE BEFORE LATE TOMORROW AFTERNOON.

THE STATE'S MOTION CONTENDS THE ORIGINAL JURIST, DIST. JUDGE JOE B. BROWN, HAS SETTLED THE MATTER BY WITHDRAWING FROM THE CASE.

THE MOTION WAS A REPLY TO ONE FILED BY ATTORNEYS FOR THE FORMER NIGHTCLUB OWNER WHO WAS CONVICTED AND SENTENCED TO DEATH IN THE NOV. 24, 1963 SHOOTING DEATH OF A PRESIDENTIAL ASSASSIN LEE HARVEY OSWALD.

RUBY'S ATTORNEYS WANT A CHANCE TO GET INTO THE RECORD TESTIMONY
ON A BOOK ABOUT THE TRIAL THEY SAY BROWN PLANNED TO PUBLISH.

BROWN HAS BEEN ASKED BY RUBY'S ATTORNEY TO BRING TO TOMORROW'S HEARING ALL RECORDS PERTAINING TO THE BOOK, "DALLAS, RUBY AND THE LAW."

BROWN RESIGNED FROM THE CASE RECENTLY, GIVING NO REASON.
