Dallas, Tex., Aug. 13 (AP)- Judge Louis Holland today set a habeas corpus hearing for Jack Ruby, convicted of killing Lee Harvey Oswald, president Kennedy's assassin, for Sept. 9.

Defense lawyer Phil Burleson of Dallas claims in his writ that Ruby is illegally confined because the trial judge, Joe B. Brown, was not qualified to hear the case. Burleson said Judge Brown had a monetary interest in the proceedings because he had contracted to write a book about the trial.

Ruby was assessed the death penalty for murdering Oswald. The conviction is being appealed, but must await a sanity hearing for Ruby scheduled for Oct. 18.
