Hearing Ordered for Ruby
DALLAS, Aug. 13 (AP)—
Judge Louis Holland today ordered a habeas corpus hearing for Jack Ruby on Sept. 9. Phil Burleson of Dallas, Ruby's lawyer, said in his writ that Ruby was illegally confined because his trial Judge, Joe B. Brown, had not been qualified to hear the case. Mr. Burleson said that Judge Brown had had a monetary interest in the proceedings because he had contracted to write a book about the Ruby murder trial. Ruby was convicted of killing Lee Harvey Oswald, President Kennedy's assassin.
