STATE DIST. JUDGE LOUIS HOLLAND OF MONTAGUE, TEX., HAS INDICATED HE WILL GRANT A DELAY IN THE SANITY HEARING IF RUBY'S ATTORNEY'S REQUEST ONE. DIST. ATTY. HENRY WADE IS NOT EXPECTED TO OPPOSE A CONTINUANCE.

PHIL BURLESON, ONE OF RUBY'S ATTORNEYS, SAID THE DEFENSE WANTS A DELAY TO GIVE TIME FOR HIGHER COURTS TO RULE ON APPEALS OF HOLLAND'S DECISIONS REGARDING PREVIOUS MOTIONS, INCLUDING A WRIT OF HABEAS CORPUS.
