POSTPONED IN TEXAS DALLAS, Oct. 18 (AP)—Dis-trict Judge Louis T. Holland granted today a defense motion for a postponement of a sanity hearing for Jack Ruby, killer of President Kennedy's assassin. The decision means that the next legal step in the compli-cated case will be taken by the Texas Court of Criminal Ap-peals in Austin. The defense lawyer, Phil Burleson, had ar-gued that to hold the sanity hearing now could be detri-mental to Ruby's position. At issue is whether the Ap-peals Court will uphold an ap-peal by the defense that a writ of habeas corpus motion should have been granted in a pro-ceedings last summer. Ruby's lawyers argued then that his death sentence was void because District Judge Joe B. Brown Sr., who presided over the murder trial, should have been disqualified. They maintained that since Judge Brown was writing a book about the case some of his judgments might have been prejudicial to Ruby. Mr. Burleson told Judge Hol-land that he thought the Court
