Fort Worth, Tex., Nov. 4 (AP) Mrs. Marguerite Oswald said today she agreed with Dallas District Attorney Henry Wade that Jack Ruby's death sentence should be reduced to life imprisonment.

But, she added, a special law should be passed to be sure that Ruby would remain behind bars for life.

Mrs. Oswald, mother of presidential assassin Lee Harvey Oswald, who was kiled by Ruby while in custody of Dallas police, said Wade's proposal -- under present laws -- would allow Ruby's parole.

"There is no law now that says Ruby would remain in prison for life if the sentence is reduced to life imprisonment," Mrs, Oswald said.

"The lawmakers will have to hold a special session and pass a law that he will not be eligible for parole."

"I would like to see Jack Ruby or any other murdered have life imprisonment instead of the death penalty," she said.

Mrs. Oswald who said she is still convinced of her son's innocence in the assassination of President John F. Kennedy, agreed with Wade that Ruby should be kept alive for interviews and historical purposes.
