

Ruby Nightclub to Become A Boxing Gym for Boys

DALLAS, April 27 (AP)—The former nightclub operated by Jack L. Ruby will soon become a boys' boxing gymnasium directed by the Dallas Police Association.
The directors of the associa-

tion have accepted an offer to take over the premises rent-free. The offer was made by Houston N. Nichols, owner of the club.

The Carousel Club was closed after Ruby was arrested in the slaying of Lee Harvey Oswald, the assassin of President Kennedy. Ruby is now under the death sentence for murder.

DALLAS, TEX., APRIL 27 (AP)—THE NIGHT CLUB OPERATED BY JACK RUBY WILL SOON BECOME A BOY'S BOXING GYMNASIUM DIRECTED BY THE DALLAS POLICE ASSOCIATION.

DIRECTORS OF THE POLICE ASSOCIATION HAVE ACCEPTED AN OFFER TO TAKE OVER THE FORMER NIGHT CLUB ON A RENT-FREE BASIS AND CONVERT IT INTO A GYM.

THE OFFER WAS MADE BY HOUSTON H. NICHOLS, OWNER OF THE CLUB. A CONTRACT, EXPECTED TO BE SIGNED FRIDAY, PROVIDES THE ASSOCIATION CAN HAVE THE FACILITIES RENT FREE UNTIL IT MIGHT BE LEASED.

THE CAROUSEL CLUB WAS CLOSED SHORTLY AFTER ITS OPERATOR, JACK RUBY, WAS ARRESTED IN THE SLAYING OF LEE HARVEY OSWALD, IDENTIFIED BY THE WARREN COMMISSION AS THE MAN WHO KILLED PRESIDENT KENNEDY. RUBY IS NOW UNDER THE DEATH SENTENCE AFTER BEING CONVICTED OF MURDER.

POLICE ASSOCIATION OFFICIALS SAID THEY WOULD BEGIN CONVERTING THE CLUB IMMEDIATELY AFTER THE CONTRACT WAS SIGNED.

THE GROUP HOPES ITS TEEN-AGE BOXERS CAN BEGIN WORKING OUT EARLY NEXT WEEK.
