

Ruby's Sanity Trial Is Set For June 13 by U.S. Judge

DALLAS, May 22 (AP)—A sanity trial for Jack Ruby, convicted slayer of Lee Harvey Oswald, has been scheduled for Monday, June 13, in this city.

District Judge Louis T. Holland of Montague set the date after conferring with state and defense lawyers.

Judge Holland, who replaced Joe B. Brown in the controversial case, took the action after the Texas Court of Criminal Appeals called last week for the sanity hearing "without delay."

Ruby was sentenced to death for the slaying on Nov. 24, 1963, of Oswald, the man the

Warren Commission identified as the assassin of President Kennedy.

The Appellate Court presumably will consider Ruby's appeal of the conviction if the sanity jury finds him sane. If found insane, he would be committed to a state mental hospital until he regained his faculties.
