DALLAS, OCT. 25 (AP)-PHIL BURLESON, ATTORNEY FOR JACK RUBY, SAYS HE MIGHT SEEK BOND FOR THE SLAYER OF LEE HARVEY OSWALD, ACCUSED ASSASSIN OF PRESIDENT JOHN F. KENNEDY.

BURLESON SAID YESTERDAY HE HAD "VERY GOOD PROSPECTS OF GETTING HIM (RUBY) OUT ON BAIL, IF WE WANTED TO MOVE IN THAT DIRECTION."

HOWEVER, BURLESON, EXPLAINED, IF RUBY WERE TO BE RELEASED ON BAIL, HE MIGHT LOSE CREDIT FOR THE THREE YEARS HE HAS SPENT IN DALLAS COUNTY JAIL ON SOME SENTENCE HE MIGHT GET IN THE FUTURE.

SUCH CREDIT, HE SAID, WOULD BE AT THE DISCRETION OF THE JUDGE IF RUBY HAD NOT BEEN RELEASED ON BAIL.

RUBY RECEIVED A DEATH SENTENCE MARCH 14, 1964, WHEN HE WAS CONVICTED OF OSWALD'S SLAYING AND HAS BEEN CONFINED SINCE.

THE TEXAS COURT OF CRIMINAL APPEALS, IN A RULING CONTESTED BY THE DALLAS DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S OFFICE, OVERTURNED RUBY'S CONVICTION RECENTLY AND ORDERED A NEW TRIAL OUTSIDE DALLAS COUNTY.

BURLESON SAID HE MAINLY WOULD BE INTERESTED IN GETTING RUBY FREED SO HE COULD WORK CLOSELY WITH HIM IN PREPARATION FOR HIS DEFENSE.
