
Jack Ruby's New Trial to Be in Wichita Falls

State District Judge Louis T. Holland announced yesterday that Jack Ruby's new trial for the slaying of Lee Harvey Oswald will be held in Wichita Falls sometime in 1967.

Holland said he selected Wichita Falls because "it is accessible to all witnesses, has ample facilities, and is made up of a multitude of good, fair, honest people."

Ruby, a 55-year-old former strip joint nightclub operator, was convicted and sentenced to death by a Dallas jury March 14, 1964, for the slaying of Oswald. The conviction was overturned last October 5.
