DALLAS OUT

DALLAS, TEX., MARCH 29 (AP)-ATTORNEYS FOR THE FAMILY OF JACK RUBY SAID TODAY THEY HAD DROPPED ATTEMPTS TO PROBATE AN UNSIGNED WILL AND WILL NOT CONTEST A 1950 RUBY WILL.

A THIRD WILL, HOWEVER, REMAINED UNDER CONTEST. IT WAS FILED BY NORMAN HOOTEN, A FORMER DEPUTY SHERIFF WHO GUARDED RUBY WHILE HE WAS IN THE DALLAS COUNTY JAIL.

RUBY DIED OF CANCER ON JAN. 3. HE WAS AWAITING A NEW TRIAL FOR MURDER IN THE SLAYING OF LEE HARVEY OSWALD, NAMED BY THE WARREN COMMISSION AS THE ASSASSIN OF PRESIDENT JOHN F. KENNEDY. HE HAD RECEIVED THE DEATH SENTENCE IN A TRIAL IN DALLAS.

HOOTEN'S LAWYERS SAID THEY WOULD ATTEMPT TO HAVE THE WILL HOOTEN HELD PROBATED AS A CODICIL TO THE 1950 DOCUMENT.

PROBATE JUDGE TED Z. ROBERTSON SCHEDULED A HEARING ON THE WILLS FOR THE MORNING OF JUNE 6.
