DALLAS, TEX., APRIL 4 (AP)-DALLAS COUNTY PROBATE JUDGE TED Z. ROBERTSON SAID TODAY A HEARING HAS BEEN SCHEDULED FOR THE FIRST WEEK IN JUNE ON THE DISPOSITION OF JACK RUBY'S WILLS.

A HEARING HAD BEEN SET FOR TODAY BUT WAS POSTPONED AFTER THE RUBY FAMILY WITHDREW CHALLENGES TO ONE OF THE DOCUMENTS.

DALLAS ATTORNEY JULES MAYER HAS ENTERED ONE WILL FOR PROBATE. HE SAID RUBY ASKED HIM TO WRITE IT IN 1950.

THE OTHER WILL IS SAID TO HAVE BEEN WRITTEN BY RUBY WHILE HE WAS IN THE DALLAS COUNTY JAIL. FORMER DALLAS DEPUTY SHERIFF NORMAN HOOTEN SAID RUBY BEQUEATHED HIM HIS (RUBY'S) RING, WATCH AND A SUIT OF CLOTHES IN THE JAIL WILL.

MAYER SAYS HE SHOULD BE NAMED PERMANENT EXECUTOR OF THE RUBY ESTATE ON THE STRENGTH OF THE 1950 WILL.

RUBY, WHO DIED OF CANCER JAN. 3, KILLED LEE HARVEY OSWALD, THE MAN THE WARREN COMMISSION SAID ASSASSINATED PRESIDENT JOHN F. KENNEDY.
