
Budget Conceals Funds For Intelligence Work

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Hidden away somewhere in the budget that President Johnson sent to Congress Tuesday are the secret accounts of a number of Government intelligence agencies.

They are thought to be spending about \$3-billion a year for activities that range from scholarly research and analysis to code breaking, from aerial spying to conventional espionage.

The Central Intelligence Agency, the best-known of these agencies, operates mostly abroad on a budget thought to be about \$500-million or \$600-million. It is mentioned in the budget only for a report on completed construction projects at its headquarters in Langley, Va.
