

F.B.I. Academy Is Accused Of Barring Dallas Police

DALLAS, June 6 (UPI)—The Federal Bureau of Investigation has refused to admit any Dallas policemen to its national training academy since the assassination of President Kennedy, The Dallas Morning News said Sunday.

The News said it was the "popular belief in the police department" that "F.B.I. Director J. Edgar Hoover himself ordered Dallas omitted."

"This suspicion is based solely on events that took place following the assassination, including the sparring between Dallas police and the F.B.I." The News said.

"The F.B.I. initially reacted to the feud by pulling out its instructors from the Dallas Police Academy a year ago," the newspaper said.
