DALLAS, TEX., JULY 15 (AP)-THE DALLAS TIMES HERALD SAID TODAY THAT TWO FBI AGENTS INVOLVED IN RELEASE OF A FEDERAL REPORT TO DALLAS POLICE INTELLIGENCE OFFICERS REPORTEDLY WERE SUSPENDED FOR 30 DAYS AND ARE BEING TRANSFERRED.

IN A COPYRIGHT STORY, THE NEWSPAPER NAMED THE AGENTS AS BOB BARRETT, BEING TRANSFERRED TO BIRMINGHAM, ALA., AND IVAN LEE, BEING REASSIGNED TO COLUMBIA, S.C.

THE FBI DECLINED COMMENT ON THE STORY.

THE TWO AGENTS HAD BEEN ASSIGNED AS LIAISON OFFICERS WITH THE DALLAS POLICE INTELLIGENCE SECTION. TWO MEMBERS OF THE SECTION HAVE BEEN TRANSFERRED TO OTHER DEPARTMENTS AS A RESULT OF THE CONTROVERSY.

THE NEWSPAPER SAID THE FBI REPORT INVOLVED THE ACTIVITIES OF UNDERWORLD INFORMER JOSEPH VALACHI. THE REPORT WAS GIVEN LT. JACK REVILL, HEAD OF THE DALLAS POLICE INTELLIGENCE SECTION, WHO FORWARDED IT TO LOS ANGELES POLICE.

LOS ANGELES OFFICERS, NOTING THAT INFORMATION ON CALIFORNIA HOODLUMS HAD BEEN OMITTED, CONTACTED THE FBI OFFICE THERE. FEDERAL AGENTS IN CALIFORNIA RECOGNIZED THE MATERIAL AND HAD IT TRACED TO DALLAS.
