North-rup, testified shortly after a 12-man jury had been selected to try Sergeant Bockenhaupt, 24 years old, in United States Dis-trict Court on the charge that he had conspired to spy for Rus-sia. If convicted, he could be sentenced to death. The German-born airman is accused of passing documents and films about United States defense plans while working in the Pentagon in 1965 and 1966. Mr. Northrup testified that while following Sergeant Boeck-enhaupt on the night of April 20, 1966, he saw Aleksey R. Malinin of the Russian Embassy get into the airman's car in nearby Arlington. He said that he had followed the two men to Fairfax in the Washington suburbs, where they pulled into a parking lot. He said they had remained in the car, talking, for almost an hour.
