KENT, Ohio, June 9 -- Fed-KENT, Ohio, June 9 — Federal Bureau of Investigation agents, sent here after the slaying of four Kent State University students in a volley of National Guard gunfire, have been questioning students and faculty about the political beliefs and teaching of some professors.

Some students and faculty members who have been questioned, however, said that the agents seemed more interested in the R.O.T.C. burning and the possibility of the students' being 'incited' than in the slayings.
