Henry A. Schutz Jr. has been named special agent in charge of the criminal division of the Federal Bureau of Investigation's New York office, its largest. Mr. Schutz will replace C. Frederick Fehl, who is being placed in charge of the Cleveland field office. Mr. Schutz, whose appointment was announced in Washington by the F.B.I.'s acting director L. Patrick Gray 3d, is 48 years old and has been with the bureau 24 years. He was chief of the general-crimes unit in Washington until last month, when he moved to the inspection division.
