Socialists Lose DEC 28 1974 Bid to Ban FBI

Supreme Court Justice Thurgood Marshall denied yesterday the Young Socialist Alliance's application for an order to block FBI surveillance of its national convention this weekend.

In a six-page opinion, Marshall wrote that mainly because the St. Louis convention is to be open to anyone under age 29, including reporters and the general public, the "extraordinary relief" sought against the FBI "is not warranted."

The alliance, a youth affiliate of the Socialist Workers party. appealed to Marshall after losing in the U.S. Court of Appeals in New York,
