INDIANS INDICTED IN 2 F.B.I. DEAT

4 Charged With Murder on Oglala Sioux Reservation

WASHINGTON, Nov. 25 (UPI) —A Federal grand jury late today indicted four Indians on charges of murdering two agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation in a shootout on the Oglala Sioux reservation of Prides Prides (1981) tion near Pine Ridge, S.D., last June 26.

Each of the four defendants of was charged with premeditated murder of Federal officers during their performance of official. duties, and with illegally causing harm to Federal law enforcement officers.

The two-count indictment returned in United States District Court in Rapid City, S.D., named the defendants as Leon-

named the defendants as Leonard Peltier, 31 years old; Robert Eugene Robideau, 29; Darrelle Dean Butler, 33, and James Theodore Eagle, 20.

A Justice Department spokesman said all but Mr. Peltier had already been taken into custody on other charges since the shootout in which Ronald A. Williams and Jack R. Coler, both 28-year-old F.B.I. men were killed.

The bureau said that the two agents had been seeking to serve a warrant on a resident of the reservation and pursuing a pickup truck that led them to the scene of the shooting.

The agents were on special assignment on the reservation, it the bureau said.
