Judge Again Sentences Clay To 5 Years and \$10,000 Fine

HOUSTON, July 24 (AP)—A Federal judge resentenced Cas-sius Clay today to the same five years in prison and \$10,-000 fine he assessed in June of 1967 after Clay's conviction on a charge of refusing induc-tion into the armed forces. There had been speculation that Judge Joe Ingraham might reduce his original sentence, but he imposed the same one in United States District Court without comment. The chief lawyer for the for-
